NOTICE is hereby given that the Annual General Meeting of **HERCULES SITE SERVICES PLC** (the "**Company**") will be held at 2.00 p.m. on 13 March 2023 at Hercules Court, Lakeside Business Park, South Cerney, Cirencester, GL7 5XL for the purpose of considering and, if thought fit, passing the below Resolutions 1-6 as ordinary resolutions and Resolution 7 as a special resolution. Printed bound copies of the Annual Report will be mailed to shareholders before the AGM.

Ordinary Business

ORDINARY RESOLUTIONS

- Resolution 1: To receive and consider the financial statements of the Company for the period ended 30 September 2022, together with the report of the directors and the report of the auditors thereon.
- Resolution 2: To authorise the appointment of Mazars LLP as auditors of the Company and to authorise the Directors to determine their remuneration.
- Resolution 3: To re-elect, as a director of the Company, Brusk Korkmaz who retires in accordance with Article 24.4 of the Company's articles of association ("Articles") and offers himself for re-election.
- Resolution 4: To re-elect, as a director of the Company, Paul Wheatcroft who retires in accordance with Article 24.4 of the Company's Articles and offers himself for re-election.
- Resolution 5: To approve a final dividend of 1.12 pence per ordinary share of £0.001 in the capital of the Company ("Ordinary Shares") for the financial year ended 30 September 2022. If the recommended final dividend is approved by shareholders, the dividend will be paid on 24 March 2023 to person appearing on the Company's register of members at the close of business on 24 February 2023. The Ordinary Shares will go ex-dividend on 23 February 2023.

Special business

Resolution 6:

THAT, pursuant to section 551 of the Companies Act 2006 (as amended) ("Act"), the Directors be and are hereby generally and unconditionally authorised to exercise all powers of the Company to allot equity securities (as defined by section 560 of the Act) up to the maximum aggregate nominal amount of £11,730 PROVIDED that the authority granted under this resolution shall lapse at the end of the next annual general meeting of the Company to be held after the date of the passing of this resolution, or, if earlier, at 6.00 p.m. on 1 August 2024, save that the Company shall be entitled to make offers or agreements before the expiry of this authority which would or might require shares to be allotted or equity securities to be granted after such expiry and the Directors shall be entitled to allot shares and grant equity securities pursuant to such offers or agreements as if this authority had not expired; and all unexercised authorities previously granted to the Directors to allot shares and grant equity securities be and are hereby revoked.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION

Resolution 7:

THAT, subject to the passing of Resolution 6 above, and in accordance with section 570 of the Act, the Directors be generally empowered to allot equity securities (as defined in section 560 of the Act) for cash pursuant to the authority conferred by Resolution 10 or by way of a sale of treasury shares, as if section 561(1) of the Act did not apply to any such allotment, provided that this power shall be limited to the allotment of equity securities:

- (a) in connection with an offer of equity securities to the holders of ordinary shares in proportion (as nearly as may be practicable) to their respective holdings; and to holders of other equity securities as required by the rights of those securities or as the Directors otherwise consider necessary, but subject to such exclusions or arrangements as the Directors may deem necessary or expedient in relation to the treasury shares, fractional entitlements, record dates, arising out of any legal or practical problems under the laws of any overseas territory or the requirements of any regulatory body or stock exchange; and
- (b) (otherwise than pursuant to sub paragraph (a) above) up to an aggregate nominal amount of £11,730;

and provided that this power shall expire on the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company, or, if earlier, at 6.00 p.m. on 1 August 2024, (unless renewed, varied or revoked by the Company prior to or on that date)

save that the Company may, before such expiry, make offer(s) or agreement(s) which would or might require equity securities to be allotted after such expiry and the Directors may allot equity securities in pursuance of any such offers or agreements notwithstanding that the power conferred by this resolution has expired.

Appointment of proxies

- As a member of the Company, you are entitled to appoint a proxy to exercise all or any of your rights to attend, speak and vote at the Annual General Meeting. You can only appoint a proxy using the procedures set out in these notes.
- A proxy does not need to be a member of the Company but must attend the Annual General Meeting to represent you. Details of how to appoint the chairman of the Annual General Meeting or another person as your proxy using the Form of Proxy are set out in the notes to the Form of Proxy. If you wish your proxy to speak on your behalf at the Annual General Meeting you must appoint your own choice of proxy (not the chairman) and give your instructions directly to the relevant person.
- You may appoint more than one proxy provided each proxy is appointed to exercise rights attached to different shares. You may not appoint more than one proxy to exercise rights attached to any one share. To appoint more than one proxy, you must complete a separate Form of Proxy for each proxy and specify against the proxy's name the number of shares over which the proxy has rights. - If you return more than one proxy appointment, either by paper or electronic communication, the appointment received last by the Registrar before the latest time for the receipt of proxies will take precedence. You are

advised to read the terms and conditions of use carefully. Electronic communication facilities are open to all shareholders and those who use them will not be disadvantaged.

- 9 The return of a completed form of proxy, electronic filing or any CREST Proxy Instruction (as described in note 11 below) will not prevent a shareholder from attending the Meeting and voting in person if he/she wishes to do so.

Proxymity

- If you are an institutional investor, you may be able to appoint a proxy electronically via the Proxymity platform, a process which has been agreed by the Company and approved by the Registrar. For further information regarding Proxymity, please go to www.proxymity.io. Your proxy must be lodged by 11.00 am on Thursday 9 March 2023 in order to be considered valid or, if the meeting is adjourned, by the time which is 48 hours before the time of the adjourned meeting. Before you can appoint a proxy via this process you will need to have agreed to Proxymity's associated terms and conditions. It is important that you read these carefully as you will be bound by them and they will govern the electronic appointment of your proxy.
- The Company, pursuant to regulation 41 of The Uncertificated Securities Regulations 2001, specifies that only those ordinary shareholders registered in the register of members of the Company 48 hours before the Annual General Meeting shall be entitled to attend or vote at the Annual General Meeting in respect of the number of Ordinary Shares registered in their name at that time. Changes to entries on the relevant register

of securities after that time will be disregarded in determining the rights of any person to attend or vote at the Annual General Meeting.

Electronic voting - via www.signalshares.com

If you wish, you will be able to vote electronically using the link www.signalshares.com. You will need to log into your Signal Shares account or register if you have not previously done so. To register you will need your Investor Code; this is detailed on your share certificate or is available from our registrars, Link Group. You can vote via www.signalshares.com by logging on and selecting the 'Proxy Voting' link. If you have not previously registered for electronic communications, you will first be asked to register as a new user, for which you will require your investor code (IVC) (which can be found on your share certificate), and postcode (if resident in the UK).

Electronic voting - via the LinkVote+ app

Link Group, the company's registrar, has launched a shareholder app: LinkVote+. It's free to download and use and gives shareholders the ability to access their shareholding record at any time and allows users to submit a proxy appointment quickly and easily online rather than through the post. The app is available to download on both the Apple App Store and Google Play, or by scanning the relevant QR code below.

Appointment of proxy by joint members

In the case of joint holders of shares, where more than one of the joint holders purports to appoint a proxy, only the appointment submitted by the most senior holder (being the first named holder in respect of the shares in the Company's register of members) will be accepted.

Changing proxy instructions

- To change your proxy instructions simply submit a new proxy appointment using the method set out in paragraph 6 above. Note that the cut off time for receipt of proxy appointments specified in that paragraph also applies in relation to amended instructions. Any amended proxy appointment received after the specified cut off time will be disregarded.
- Where you have appointed a proxy using the hard copy Form of Proxy and would like to change the instructions using another hard copy Form of Proxy, please contact the Registrar as indicated in paragraph 3 above.
- If you submit more than one valid proxy appointment, the appointment received last before the latest time for the receipt of proxies will take precedence.

Termination of proxy appointments

In order to revoke a proxy instruction you will need to inform the Company by sending a signed hard copy notice clearly stating your intention to revoke your proxy appointment to the Registrar as indicated in

paragraph 3 above. In the case of a member which is a company, the revocation notice must be executed under its common seal or signed on its behalf by an officer of the company or an attorney for the company. Any power of attorney or any other authority under which the revocation notice is signed (or a duly certified copy of such power or authority) must be included with the revocation notice.

- The revocation notice must be received by the Company no later than 2.00 p.m. on 23 February 2023.
- If you attempt to revoke your proxy appointment but the revocation is received after the time specified then, subject to paragraph 26 below, your proxy appointment will remain valid.
- Appointment of a proxy does not preclude you from attending the Annual General Meeting and voting in person. If you have appointed a proxy and attend the Annual General Meeting in person, your proxy appointment will automatically be terminated.

Total voting rights

As at 25 January 2023, being the last practicable date before dispatch of this Notice of Annual General Meeting, the Company's issued share capital comprised 58,650,206 ordinary shares of £0.001 each. Each ordinary share carries the right to one vote at an Annual General Meeting of the Company and, therefore, the total number of voting rights in the Company as at 25 January 2023 is 58,650,206.
